Commitment to ethical conduct is an expectation of all students and staff of the Blind Brook School Community. Core principles, such as respect, responsibility, honesty, civility and cooperation should be at the heart of our interactions and our relationships.

- As a center of learning, our school should be a place where all students feel welcomed and encouraged. Students and staff are expected to treat all others, regardless of differences, with respect and kindness.
- Behavior that marginalizes or demeans students and/or staff has no place in our school or in our community. No individual in our school community should ever harass, bully or intimidate.
- Academic honesty and integrity is expected of all students. Students and staff are expected to act in a manner that promotes teaching, learning and accountability.
- The school environment should be treated with care and respect.
- In addition to the regulations of the Blind Brook – Rye Board of Education, students and staff are expected to respect and comply with all applicable federal, provincial and municipal laws.
- Students must not be in possession of, or under the influence of, or provide others with, alcohol or illegal drugs.
- No member of the school community should be in the possession of any object that can be used to threaten or intimidate another individual in the community.

Principled and ethical behavior fosters a sense of belonging and well being in communities. In the Blind Brook Schools, we believe in setting high standards for behavior in the hope of helping our students developing both strong character and sharp minds.
