Guide lines for creating your Works Cited Page

- 1. The works cited section of a report appears at the end and always starts a new page with the title **Works Cited** centered at the top.
- 2. Sources are alphabetized by the **first** word of the entries (usually the author's last name).
- 3. Sources are **not numbered** 1, 2, 3 in the works cited listing.
- 4. Sources are **not labeled** A, B, C in the works cited listing.
- 5. The **first** line of each entry starts at the **left** margin and the **second** line and all **succeeding** lines are indented five spaces.
 - a. In MS Word use Ctrl Tab to indent
 - b. In Google Docs put the cursor in front of the second line and press [Enter], then use the tab key to indent.
- 6. Each entry is **double spaced** with a **double space** between entries.
- 7. See the next page for a sample works cited page.
