About the Blind Brook Schools

Blind Brook serves approximately 1,400 students and consists of three schools on two campuses: the Bruno M. Ponterio Ridge Street School, which accommodates students in grades K-5; the Blind Brook Middle School, which is home to students in grades 6-8, and the Blind Brook High School for students in grades 9-12. The middle school and high school share a campus and some facilities. Class sizes average between 20-24 students. Blind Brook has recently completed a large-scale construction project which included an update to the primary grade wing and the addition of dedicated STEAM-based learning rooms including a Maker Space at our elementary school. The project also included the building of an MIT-inspired FabLab at our middle school/high school campus which will serve as a focal point for project-based learning in the district.

Application Process

- Submit [Non-Resident Student Intake Form](#) with all requested student academic, medical, attendance and discipline records to building principal (see below)
- Building Principal reviews application material and records
- Parent/Guardian & Student entrance interview with principal if records are satisfactory
- Superintendent reviews materials and recommendation by Principal and may call for personal interview

Acceptance Process

- Superintendent recommends acceptance and Board approval
- Parent/Guardian receives tuition contract with deposit and tuition information
- Upon receipt of tuition deposit, the Non-Resident Student Application will be approved by Superintendent and forwarded to Pupil Services Department for registration
- Tuition must be paid in full before the student may attend classes

Acceptance Considerations

- Sufficient space to accommodate the non-resident student
- Increase in the size of the faculty or staff shall not be necessary
- Admission shall not result in the establishment of a new section
- Parents/Guardians provide their own transportation at no cost to the district
- All school rules and district regulations in effect for district students shall apply to non-resident students

Tuition*

- K-6 Tuition for the 2024-2025 School Year is \$25,331
- 7-12 Tuition for the 2024-2025 School Year is \$31,846
