## **Community Objectives for BMPRSS**

- Voters in 2017 overwhelmingly supported investing in the modernization of the Bruno M Ponterio Ridge Street School for the first time in half a century
- From the outset, the mission has been to create a 21st century learning center for our students. A school that is a safe and comfortable space and is both environmentally appropriate and flexible enough to meet future programming needs
- Completing BMPRSS will achieve this mission and provide a benefit to the community for years to come







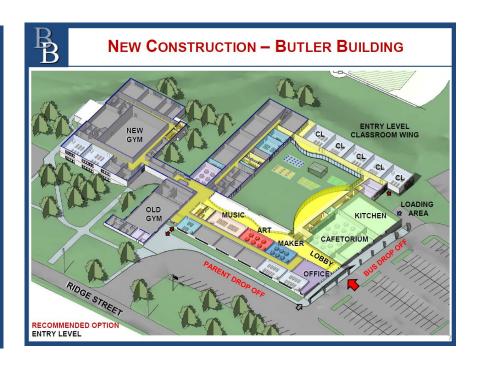
## **Original Budget**

The BMPRSS capital project was approved in October 2017 in an effort to modernize our aging elementary school



#### Why is the BMPRSS Project being Proposed?

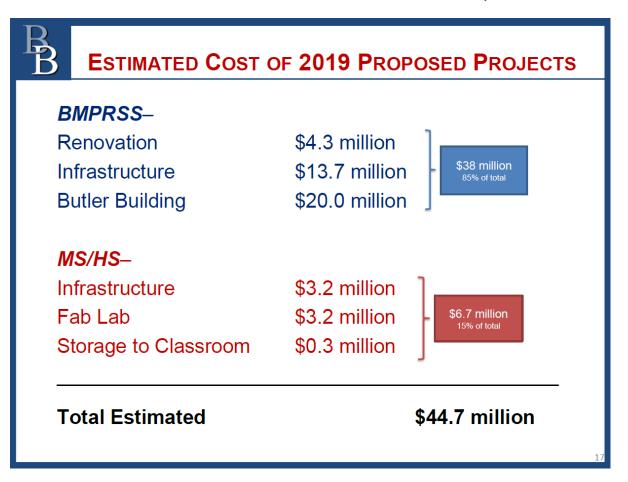
- 1. It has been 50+ years since the last significant renovation to the Bruno M. Ponterio Ridge Street School (BMPRSS).
- 2. Maintaining the Butler Wing (kindergarten & 1<sup>st</sup> grade), kitchen, and cafeteria is no longer a justifiable expense.
- 3. Replacing outdated small classrooms with environmentally appropriate and flexible learning spaces will meet current and future programming needs for the 21st century.
- 4. Critical Infrastructure items such as electrical panels, fire alarms, and ventilation systems need replacement.
- 5. Renovations to Library Wing and Main Office Wing classrooms and offices.





## **Original Budget**

The overall project was scheduled to be completed at the end of 2020 and was estimated to cost \$44.7 million





## **Updated timing of RSS project**

The updated schedule shows the completion of the project in the Spring of 2022

## How much more money is needed?

There have been significant cost overruns on the project

Based on our current estimates, the district will need another \$4.8 to \$6 million to complete the project

### **Additional authorization**

The district requests authorization for <u>up to</u> an additional \$6 million to complete the project with two core principles in mind

- 1. Act in a fiscally responsible manner by finding the smallest debt increase possible that provides certainty on the project and
- 2. Don't take away money from the classrooms and students

## Financing alternatives

- District will request authorization to borrow <u>up to \$6 million</u> to finish the Ridge Street School project
- Decision on amount and form of borrowing does not need to be made until January
  - We will only borrow what we need
- Two main sources of financing options
  - Bond Anticipation Notes short term, lower interest rate
  - Bonds 20 year, not prepayable for 9 years
- Board deciding on options to finance
  - Trade-off between near term certainty on interest rate vs. flexibility
- Any amounts recovered in the future will be used to repay debt



#### Estimated Annual School Tax Increase if Debt = \$6.0 Million

The additional bond debt service will be payable over 20 years with the first-year payment equal to \$345,361.52

## Why did costs escalate?

- Change Orders from General Contractor and other prime contractors of over \$5 million including:
  - Redesign of HVAC System
  - Steel frame issues on roof
  - Structural reinforcement of windows and temporary windows
  - Corridor redesign between 1955 wing and new classroom wing
  - Overtime
- Additional professional services were required
  - Project management has extended longer than anticipated
  - Other services including legal, architectural consultants, experts and other personnel

#### Two important notes

- All approved change orders are posted onto the district website and are available for public review
- It is premature at this time to discuss fault or liability issues



## Steps taken

We understand the community's frustration with the project and have taken steps to increase the rigor and scrutiny applied at each step going forward

- Engaged BBS Architects as consultants
  - will remain involved as necessary to maintain progress
- Leveraged community input and expertise by reinstating the Facilities Committee
  - 17 members divided into Construction, Finance & Bond and Communications/Community Relations Subcommittees
  - Construction Project Subcommittee includes 7 community members with extensive project management experience
- Engaged EFPR Accountants to perform an independent review of the project financials
  - Tentatively scheduled to present at November 16th meeting



## New processes put in place

- All change orders will receive increased scrutiny
  - BBS will review all proposed change orders
  - Facilities committee will remain involved
- Preparation for inspections
  - BBS to stage full walkthroughs of each phase prior to any inspection
  - Greater engagement with inspectors and SED
- Tap into community expertise
  - Standing weekly meeting with Facilities Committee to identify trouble spots and attempt to rectify issues quickly



## A Reminder on the Cafetorium

- The cafetorium is both a cafeteria and an auditorium with retractable seating for up to 350 people.
- A modern and expanded kitchen will allow for preparation of new, healthy student lunch options.
- Create a large group assembly space, and fully functional performance space with full-sized stage.







## What if bond vote fails?

- Project likely to run out of authorized funds somewhere between January and February, 2022
  - Cash will be available, but once invoiced amount exceeds authorized amounts, project will need to halt
- Without voter approval, district will likely be forced to close up unfinished cafetorium and utilize currently available space
  - Children continue to eat in gym, classrooms and outside
  - Outside of building will remain unfinished for an extended period of time
- The board would consider alternative solutions in consultation with counsel, including reviewing whether the incomplete building would create a public emergency
